THE COCONINO RURAL ENVIRONMENT CORPS models its corps programs after the Civilian Conservation Corps of the 1930s, effective throughout the Reconstruction era at meeting critical social and environmental needs.

The NORTHERN ARIZONA CONSERVATION CORPS, a program for young adults aged 18-25, and the ARIZONA NORTHLANDS YOUTH CORPS, for high-school students aged 15-18, teach its Corpsmembers how to become stewards of the land. Through the challenging, hands-on implementation of project work, listed to the right, they develop life and work skills while repairing historical damage to the environment and leearning about contemporary environmental conservation issues.

Since 1997, the Coconino Rural Environment Corps has been providing service and conservation work in collaboration with a variety of land management partners. Based out of Flagstaff, Arizona, crews travel and spike camp around the region to carry out work projects, partnering on short and long-term projects and assisting in the development of large-scale, ongoing projects. Crews are also trained for special projects in order to meet the needs of our partners.

- ·Trail construction and maintenance
- •Forest restoration for wildfire fuel reduction and forest health

LIFE AS A CORPSMEMBER

Corpsmembers work as a team under the leadership of a trained, experienced crew supervisor, learning outdoor skills and engaging in public service projects that address environmental conservation needs in Northern Arizona. Service work is almost exclusively outdoors, involves strenuous physical labor in all weather conditions and climates, and involves spike camping for severl days at a time in remote wilderness locations.
