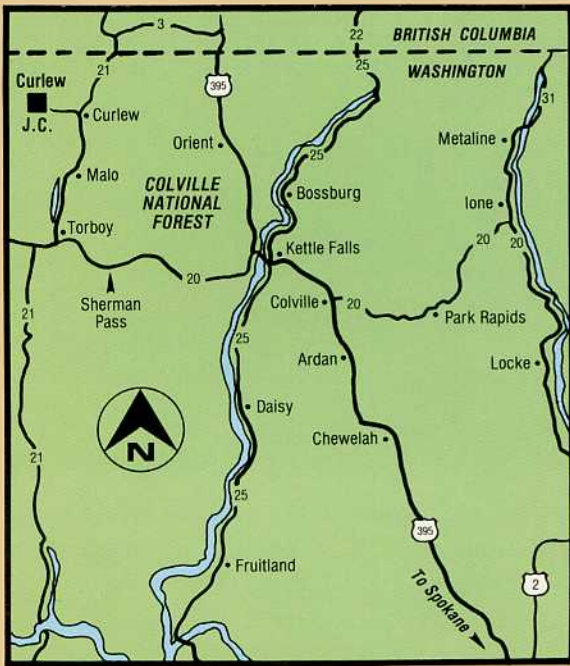

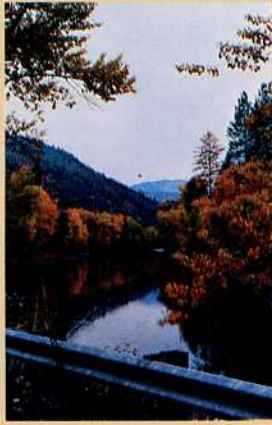

The Center

We are located in northeastern Washington on the beautiful Colville National Forest, approximately 130 miles northwest of Spokane and about 10 miles south of the Canadian border. The center is relatively small serving 198 male residents living in remodeled barracks-type dormitories. Each dormitory has a lounge area for visiting, reading, watching television and social activities. Laundry facilities are available on center.



Education and Training

Our purpose is to prepare you for the working world. You learn at your own pace while you attend education classes and receive training in a variety of vocational areas.

Health Care

You receive basic health and medical services, including dental and eye care, as well as an initial examination when you arrive at the Center.

Meals

You dine cafeteria-style in a bright, comfortable dining room. Meals are served three times a day on weekdays with a hearty brunch and dinner on weekends.

Pay

In Job Corps you earn while you learn, starting at \$40.00 a month with a possibility of earning up to \$100.00 a month. Raises are based on good performance, achievement and length of stay in Job Corps. Payday is twice a month.

Another \$75.00 to \$100.00 a month is set aside for you, and after you complete the program, it's used to help you begin your new job.

Clothing

An annual clothing allowance of \$317.00 will be given to you the first year of enrollment, with \$103 for the second year.

In addition, all vocational and protective clothing such as rain gear, boots, hard hats, etc., are provided at no cost to you.

Leisure Time

Recreation at Curlew includes use of a gymnasium, basketball and volleyball courts, a baseball field, universal weight machines, pool tables. Corpsmembers can participate in intramural sports and a horseback riding program. There are lessons in Arts & Crafts including ceramics, painting and leatherwork. Also available is a student operated canteen. Weekend passes are available. The center also sponsors many trips of interest to nearby scenic areas and Canada.
