



The Center

We are located in the Nantahala National Forest 8 miles west of Franklin, NC. It is a Forest Service conservation center and has a fire fighting team. There are about 55 females and 150 males living in pleasant dormitories.

All dorms have lounges for reading, watching TV (VCR & satellite) and social activities.

Health Care

You receive basic health and medical services, including dental and eye care, as well as an initial examination when you arrive at the Center.

Meals

You dine cafeteria-style in a bright, comfortable dining room. Meals are served three times a day on weekends with a hearty brunch and dinner on weekends.

Pay

In Job Corps you earn while you learn, starting at \$40.00 a month with a possibility of earning up to \$100.00 a month. Raises are based on good performance, achievement and length of stay in Job Corps. Payday is twice a month.

Another \$75.00 to \$100.00 a month is set aside for you, and after you complete the program, it's used to help you begin your new job.

Clothing

An annual clothing allowance of \$317.00 will be given to you the first year of enrollment, with \$103 for the second year.

In addition, all vocational and protective clothing such as rain gear, boots, hard hats, etc., are provided at no cost to you.

Leisure Time

Recreation at LBJ includes use of our gymnasium, indoor and outdoor basketball courts, volleyball, universal weight machines, pool tables, ping pong, and intramural sports. Also available are lessons in arts & crafts, ceramics, painting, leathercraft and a student operated canteen. The Center sponsors trips to Six Flags over Georgia, Carowinds, SC, hiking, and whitewater rafting. We have organized basketball and softball teams, field days, picnics and scenic trips to the mountains and waterfalls.
