☐ assistance in the assembly of lake, wetland, woodland and resources inventories, and determining significant and sensitive features of existing resources;

☐ assist the work of public interest and environmental advocacy groups;

☐ assist in the assembly of data of resource inventories and to clear debris from shorelines and bodies of water.

☐ assistance to clean up parks and other recreational areas;

☐ construction of wildlife indentification trails and monitoring and maintenance of wildlife habitats:

of data on environmental and public health and safety hazards;

☐ assistance in environmental and resource protection, conservation and enhancement activities.

Environmental Youth Corps has the potential to have a major impact on Ontario's environment and Ontario's youth.
