COMMITMENT TO SERVICE.

Going out into the community and providing the services that are needed - that's your commitment to your community. The Service Corps is for those people who want to improve the quality of life for everyone in the community.

YOUR INVESTMENT IN THE FUTURE.

You will learn new skills, and receive work and training experience that will prove extremely valuable to your future, personally and professionally. What's more, it might help you decide what you want to do with the rest of your life.

We will pay you a stipend of \$475 a month and provide health insurance. And we offer opportunities to continue your education, both during and after your WSC experience.

WORKING WITH PEOPLE.

Your assignment in the Service Corps might find you working with the poor, the handicapped or the elderly. You might perform a research project, work in a counseling center, provide information and referral services or care for the sick.

YOUR SPONSORING AGENCY.

You could be working for any one of several hundred private or public organizations.

Agencies submit project proposals addressing genuine community needs which are presently unmet. After a proposal is approved, the skills required to perform it will be matched with the skills, goals and desires of Service Corps members.



ELIGIBILITY.

You must be an unemployed resident of Washington state between the ages of 18 and 25. A special effort is made to recruit minority and disadvantaged people, and preference will be given to applicants residing in areas where unemployment is higher than the state average.

FROM SIX MONTHS TO A YEAR.

Most projects will be six months; but a project may be continued to up to twelve months.
